Reader 1: “By the waters of Babylon, there we sat down and wept when we remembered Zion. . . . For there our captors required of us songs, and our tormentors, mirth, saying, ‘Sing us one of the songs of Zion.’”  
*(Psalm 137:1, 3)*

Reader 2: “I have stood in a meeting with hundreds of youngsters and joined in while they sang “Ain’t Gonna Let Nobody Turn Me Round.” It is not just a song; it is a resolve. . . . These songs bind us together, give us courage together, help us march together.”  
*(MLK, “Why We Can’t Wait”)*

*(MLK, “Where Do We Go from Here?”)*

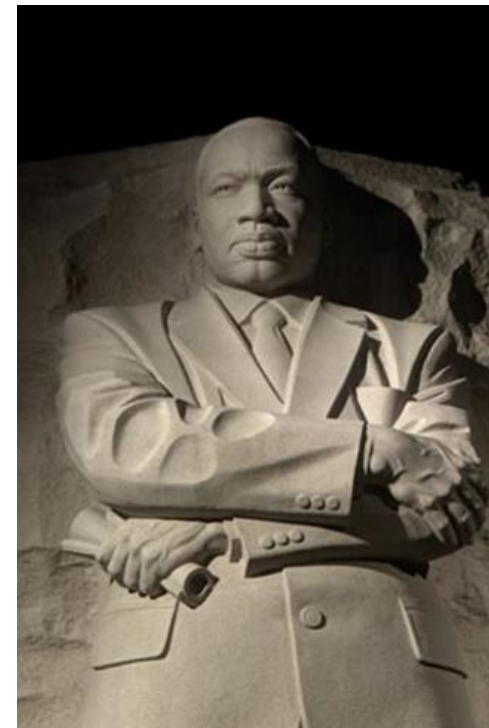
***All: For your realm, which stands beyond and against all nations, and your justice, which judges all people, we give you thanks, O God.***
