The **green paraments** symbolize Ordinary Time, the longest season of the church liturgical year, which is a continuation of the Season of Epiphany that began the Sunday after Epiphany and ended with Ash Wednesday. Ordinary Time begins on the Sunday after Pentecost and ends with Reign of Christ Sunday, the Sunday before Advent begins. Since it explores the mission of the church, the traditional color for this season is green, symbolizing growth. Ordinary Time also focuses on the important issue of how we can continually grow as disciples of Jesus Christ.

School Kits Needed for Church World Service

Every fall the United Church has been involved with drives to assemble and ship Baby, Hygiene, and School Kits to Church World Service (CWS). CWS is an organization of over 35 Christian denominations from around the world which responds to human needs resulting from natural and human disasters giving immediate help and continuing support for the long haul. Due to the large number of recent natural disasters and continuing war conflicts, CWS has sent out an urgent request to replenish their stocks of School Kits.

The Minnesota Conference and National Office of the UCC Disaster Ministries has responded to this request by allocating \$50,000 of their Disaster funds to encourage congregations to respond to the CWS request. They are offering 200 grants of \$250 each, on a first come, first served basis. To apply, we must match the \$250. The Board of Trustees guaranteed our match and as of Sunday (7/20/2014) we have raised \$120. Our Grant request was submitted last Wednesday and we expect it to be granted.

We have assembled from 30 to 50 School Kits each of the last 4 – 5 years. This year we have pledged 100 School Kits to be assembled, packed and shipped by the last week of August.

The list of items to be included in a School Kit are:

- One pair of blunt metal scissors (rounded tip)
- Three 70-count wide ruled spiral notebooks or notebooks totaling 200 -210 pages. (No loose-leaf or filler paper.)
- One 30-centimeter ruler (12")
- One hand-held pencil sharpener
- One large eraser
- Six new pencils with erasers
- One box of 24 crayons (only 24)

- One 12" x 14" to 14" x 17" finished size cotton or light weight canvas bag with cloth handles. (Please, no reusable shopping bags or backpacks.)

Presently many of the stores are having sales on School Supplies which will help in reaching our goal of 100. If you are unable to go shopping for the above items we will accept cash donations to help offset the cost of shipping, paying off the Trustees advance or the purchase of Kit items.

We will need assistance in cutting and sewing bags for each Kit. Search your fabric cache for material that could be used for constructing bags.
